

Mars Curiosity rover talks in May

“Exploring Mars with *Curiosity*” is the title of the spring Frontiers in Science program coming up in May. Roger Wiens, with the Lab’s Space and Remote Sensing group and principal investigator for the ChemCam laser experiment, will talk about the rover, its journey to Mars and some of the discoveries it’s making on the Red Planet. ChemCam is analyzing the planet’s composition through the use of a laser that vaporizes what it hits so an optical spectrometer can read the resulting plasma.

After the lecture, Wiens will sign copies of his book *Red Rover: Inside the Story of Robotic Space Exploration, from Genesis to the Mars Rover Curiosity*. The book is available from most booksellers and can be brought to the talk for the book signing. All royalties are donated to Habitat for Humanity.
