

# Using the Library Catalog (Primo) Offsite

Start at the library's external home page



Click on the OFFSITE Lab employee button




Next you should see the LANL weblogin page. Use your Z number and cryptocard passcode here.

*Note: This setup is designed to check for an active login session. If you have already logged in very recently to the library, LANL mail, timecard etc. offsite, it will see that you have a session and not present this page.*




## Using the Library Catalog (Primo) Offsite

Next you will see the Library Search page. Please note that \*.lanl.idm.oclc.org is in the address on the address bar. It means that you are in the proxy and therefore should be able to access licensed content. The address on this page should look exactly like the highlighted address (www.lanl.gov.lanl.idm.oclc.org/library/onsite.php)



Put in your search term(s) and click Search.



## Using the Library Catalog (Primo) Offsite

It should take you to the Primo results page. The address should contain the highlighted part in the address bar (again \*.lanl.idm.oclc.org). This means you are still using the proxy and therefore will be recognized by a content vendor as legitimately using the licensed resource.

Click the View tab of the resource you are interested in and the link for the vendor that is providing it.




## Using the Library Catalog (Primo) Offsite

The address should contain the highlighted part in the address bar (again \*.lanl.idm.oclc.org). This means you are still using the proxy.

Publisher/vendor pages are all different from each other. They often present the full text article as part of the article landing page and provide a link for the PDF. Here the PDF link is below some metadata for the article.



Clicking on the PDF link takes you to the article. Notice again that the highlighted address contains \*.lanl.idm.oclc.org. You are still in the proxy.
